

1. Turn **left** out of Wheel Fun Rentals onto bike path. A
2. **Cross over bridge** and continue on bike path along water to Huntington City Beach/Pier. B-E
3. Return to bike path at Pier. Continue **south** along **bike path** towards Huntington State Beach. F
4. Ride approximately 3 miles and **cross over bridge** continuing on the path.
5. Veer **left** when path splits and follow bike path along highway. **Cross 2nd bridge** and continue **straight**. G
6. Immediately across the bridge, cut through to the **right** and continue **South** along **Seashore Dr.**
7. Turn **right** on **36th St.**
8. When you arrive at the end of 36th St., turn **left** on **bike path** and ride to the Newport Pier. H-I
9. As you exit the pier, turn **right** onto the **bike path** from pier plaza and continue **South** along path. Follow path until you arrive at the Balboa Pier and Plaza. J-K
10. After departing the pier, turn right as bike path resumes at end of Pier/ Peninsula Park.
11. At the end of bike path, **turn around** and ride back towards Newport Beach to **36th St.**
12. Turn **right** on **36th St.**
13. Turn **left** on **Seashore Dr.**
14. At the end of Seashore Dr., cut through to your right to continue **North** along bike path.
15. Cross bridge and follow path approximately 10 miles back to WFR.

## Bolsa Chica State Beach to Newport Beach

**A** **Bolsa Chica Jetty**  
Bolsa Chica is known for excellent surfing. The jetties are a popular surfing area, as it provides larger, faster waves for more experienced surfers.



**B** **Huntington Beach Dog Beach**  
A paradise for dogs where they can frolic in the water and taste a sense of freedom — rarely found elsewhere.




**C** **Huntington Beach Pier**  
The pier is the longest concrete municipal pier in California. A fixture in the city for over 100 years, it is the most visited landmark at Huntington City Beach. Check out Tower Zero, the state-of-the-art lifeguard tower to find water temperatures, wave conditions and other information posted regularly.




**D** **Huntington Beach Main Street**  
Over 50 places to dine and shop! You'll likely see swimsuits, surfboards, people walking dogs, cars, bicycle and lots of smiles. The perfect place to enjoy an hour or a day.




**E** **International Surfing Museum**  
While visiting Surf City USA, you definitely want to visit the International Surfing Museum. ½ Block down Olive Street off Main Street you will find the museum, which highlights the surfing culture and showcases nearly a century of the best surf memorabilia that Surf City has to offer. Every aspect of the surfing culture is represented here with displays, concerts, catalogued surf artifacts, surfboards, surfing films, surfing music and plenty of memorabilia.



**F** **Huntington State Beach**  
This family friendly beach is connected to Huntington City Beach where there is plenty of room for bicycling, surfing, body boarding, skating and surf fishing. The beach also has fire rings for bonfires. At the southern end across Pacific Coast Highway are the Huntington Beach Wetlands, operated by the Department of Fish and Game.




**G** **Santa Ana River**  
The Santa Ana River begins almost 75 miles away in San Bernardino County, California, in the San Bernardino National Forest. It eventually reaches its end between Huntington Beach and Newport Beach, where it spills into the Pacific Ocean. Despite much of the river being channelized in recent times, it still represents one of the largest river systems in Southern California.




**H** **Newport Municipal Beach**  
Newport Beach offers fine, soft sand with plenty of room to stretch out and enjoy yourself. Surfers, swimmers and sunbathers all bask in the warmth of beautiful Southern California winter and summer days. Pelicans and seagulls also enjoy the year round Mediterranean climate.



**I** **Newport Beach Pier**  
The Pier is a whirlwind of activity. People of all ages flock here on bikes, skates and foot. There are many food-to-go shops and sit down restaurants near the pier.



**J** **Balboa Pier / Balboa Beach**  
Balboa Beach is a friendly beach destination with a kids playground and sand lot, public restrooms and much to see and do. You can ride the Balboa Ferry across the Bay to Balboa Island. The island has shopping, eateries and more.



**K** **Peninsula Park**  
Near the Balboa Pier, this park is the perfect place to take a break. It has barbecues, picnic tables, benches, play area and swings, restrooms, gazebo with benches and checker boards, multi-purpose athletic field, water fountains and great views of the ocean and beach.
